1 **A Bill to Make Illegal PIPA and SOPA-based Legislation Within the United States of America**

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

3 **Section 1:** Any legislature containing or imitating key points within bills such as PIPA and SOPA would
4 hereby become illegal within the United States.

5 **Section 2:** The definitions of PIPA and SOPA are hereby classified as:

6 A.) PIPA is defined as the Protect Intellectual Property Act

7 B.) SOPA is defined as the Stop Online Piracy Act.

8 **Section 3:** The defining feature to hereby make certain legislature illegal would be classified as:

9 A.) The ability to negatively affect the freedom of speech for citizens both foreign and domestic.

10 B.) The ability to dictate and or censor information over the Internet for any reason other than
11 National Security threats.

12 C.) The ability to forcefully remove another person's content from the Internet without a court case,
13 warrant, or due legal process.

14 **Section 4:** The United States Congress and the President of the United States of America will have the power
15 to determine what such legislature is classified as, and will have the power to indefinitely table legislature
16 containing key points as defined in Section 3.

17 **Section 5:** This bill will go into effect immediately after passage.

18 **Section 6:** Any issue, whether it be congressional or civilian, pertaining to the points, ideas, implementation,
19 or the effects of such legislature would be dropped and it would be illegal to pursue any other action
20 regarding legislature as described in Section 3.

21 **Section 7:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Create a College Grant for any Student with a 3.5 GPA or higher

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** A state budget shall be created to give any student that manages a 3.5

3 GPA in high school \$1,500 for the students first year of college. The

4 purpose of this bill is to increase the incentive for further education.

5 **SECTION 2.** Not any student shall be eligible for the grant. The grant will be limited to

6 students whose parents combined income is less than \$90,000 a year.

7 Once the student is enrolled in college and continues to maintain a 3.5

8 GPA that student shall continue to receive the \$1,500 per year for a

9 maximum of 4 years.

10 **SECTION 3.** The Idaho State Department of Education shall oversee the

11 implementation of this bill.

12 A. The funding for this bill shall come from a .5 % tax increase on all

13 tobacco products.

14 **SECTION 4.** This bill shall take effect in the beginning of the 2012-2013 school year.

A Bill to Preserve More Land and Wildlife for National Parks

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. The National Parks should be preserved more land and wildlife for expansion of the parks, and increased living environments for all organisms that live or take shelter within the parks.

SECTION 2. Land and Wildlife will be described as any area of non-developed land near or adjacent to any existing National Parks. Purchase of said land will take part with funds acquired from grants given to National Park services, pending approval and cooperation from National Parks

SECTION 3. This Bill will be enforced by the combined services of the National Parks Service and the Bureau of Land Management.

SECTION 4. This Bill will take effect six months after passage.

A Resolution to Re-Initiate and Proceed With the Six-Party Talks

13. days of the passing of this bill, and shall be completed no later than
14. January 1st, 2012.

15. **Section V:** The responsibility and means of enforcing this bill will be placed upon the
16. President of the United States of America.

17. **Section VI:** All laws in conflict with the provisions of this bill shall be declared
18. null and void.

**A Bill to Increase Federal Funding of Embryonic Stem Cell Research \$1.36
Billion Dollars Via the National Institute of Health.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Section 1

A. The United States Federal Government will fund an additional \$1.36 billion dollars to the National Institute of Health to pursue and encourage Embryonic Stem Cell Research initiatives on a national scale.

Section 1

B. Funding at the national level ensures an equal distribution of valuable treatment and research opportunities will be provided to all U.S. citizens, no matter their state of residency. Research centers that may be unable to continue or emerge because of state funding constraints will be nationally funded, while existing programs will be allowed private and state funding in addition to that of the federal government.

Section 2. The current federal funding to the National Institute of Health specifically for nationwide Embryonic Stem Cell initiatives will be increased from its existing amount of \$640 million dollars per year by \$1.36 billion dollars per year to allot a total of \$2 billion dollars to the field. The NIH will distribute funding among all states to provide nationwide research opportunities and treatment possibilities in all states to those who so choose.

Section 3. This bill shall be effective 91 days after passage.

Section 4. All laws, executive orders, and supreme court rulings in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

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A BILL TO PROMOTE AWARENESS AND UNDERSTANDING OF CYBER BULLYING

A Bill to increase the Federal funding budget \$7.73 billion for special education living skills classes at the secondary level.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** An increase in the Federal funding budget for special education living
3 skills classes at the secondary level is necessary in order to facilitate the
4 living independence and economic productivity of these students.

5 **SECTION 2.** The funding for the special education living skills program at the
6 secondary level will be given an additional \$7.73 billion of federal
7 I.D.E.A. (Individuals with Disabilities Education Act) funds to the
8 department of education. This funding will come from the federal I.D.E.A.
9 funding that is allocated through congress and will be under the
10 jurisdiction of the special education department. If indeed this measure is
11 passed it will bring the federal government's level of support to less than
12 half the 40% originally promised to special education programs in 1975.

13 **SECTION 3. A.** Life skills include the skills the students need to be successful in
14 society. Students with life skills programs are often those with severe
15 learning disabilities, autistic spectrum, developmental disorders etc. They
16 need strategies in place to help them learn essential life skills. They learn
17 to be responsible for care of property, how to behave under different
18 societal settings circumstances, how to shop for groceries, and practice
19 simple work routines. Life skills classes help special education students
20 become better citizens, and develop self-worth and independence.

21 **B.** There are many long-term economic benefits to life skills courses for
22 these students as well. Economically many of these students are able to
23 hold steady jobs after training and can contribute to the economy and have
24 independence outside of state and family assistance.

25 **SECTION 4.** This law will take effect within six months of passage.

26 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A **Bill** to amend the Harmful Algal Bloom and Hypoxia Research and Control Act of 1998.

To be enacted by the student congress here assembled that

Section 1: To establish an Inter-Agency Task Force on Harmful Algal Blooms and Hypoxia.

Section 2: The Task Force will be responsible for developing a national strategy to address marine and freshwater harmful algal bloom and hypoxia events and to promote activities and an action strategy to implement such Program

Section 3: The provisions of this bill shall take effect immediately.

Section 4: Enactment shall be done through the Committee of Environment and Natural Resources of the National Science and Technology Council.

Section 5: All laws in conflict with the provisions of this bill shall be declared null and void.
