A Bill to require all people over 60 to take a driving test every 2 years

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** All US citizen's drivers licenses will expire at age 60 and they will not be
3 issued a new one until they pass a driving test.

4 **SECTION 2.** Driving test: a driving skills test to see if a person is capable of driving a
5 motor vehicle.

6 **SECTION 3.**

7 **A. Bill will be enforced by the department of motor vehicles**

8 **B funding for this bill will be provided by the person wishing to be**
9 **tested for their driving skills.**

10 **SECTION 4.** This law will take effect within one year of passage. Everyone over 60 the
11 day of passage will have one year to report to a DMV to get tested. If
12 failure to take test or pass test driving privileges will be revoked.

13 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

1 **A Bill to Redesign the U.S. Currency**

2 BE IT ENACTED BY STUDENT CONGRESS ASSEMBLED THAT:

3 **Section 1.** A law is created to redesign the United State’s paper currency.

4 **Section 2.** Those individuals who are blind and visually impaired have difficulty
5 distinguishing between currencies of different values, as they are all the same texture,
6 color, and size.

7 **Section 3.** The Rehabilitation Act states that: “(1) effectuation of the statute's objectives
8 of assisting the handicapped; and (2) the need to impose reasonable boundaries in
9 accomplishing this purpose” (“Ruling”). And Article1, Section 8 of the Constitution, it
10 gives Congress the power to coin money and fix the Standard weights and measurements.
11 The following definition will be used for the purposes of this law:

12 **A.** Redesign shall mean to change only the physical features of currency
13 and not the value.

14 **Section 4.** This bill will go into force 6 months after its enactment. After the 6 months all
15 printing of paper currency in the U.S. will be the new design of different color along with
16 a physical indication of the different currency’s worth.

17 **Section 5.**

18 **A.** Executives of the Department of the Treasury and other agencies affiliated such as;
19 The U.S. Mint, and The Bureau of Engraving and Printing will primarily be
20 responsible for the enforcement of this bill.

21 **B.** Funding will come from Congress that will allocate \$50 million to this project.

22 **Section 6.** All laws in conflict with this new law shall be declared null and void.

A Bill to Ban the Distribution, Selling, Importation, or Use of All Tobacco Products in the United States of America.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** This bill will make the distribution, importation, selling, or use of tobacco
3 products in the United States of America illegal.

4 **SECTION 2.** Tobacco products are defined as including: cigarettes of all flavors brands and
5 styles, cigars of all flavors brands and styles (including Cuban), all flavors brands and styles of
6 chewing tobacco, snuff in all flavors styles and brands, bidis (dry rolled up tobacco leaves),
7 hookahs, and pipe tobacco of all flavors brands and styles.

8 **SECTION 3:** The U.S. Food and Drug Administration will be the government agency that will
9 oversee the enforcement of this bill, with the help of all local law enforcement.

10 **SECTION 4:** This bill will take effect at the time the bill is passed and ratified by this body
11 with a six month education and implementation period preceding full enactment.

12 **SECTION 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to ban high speed police pursuits.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** United States federal government hereby bans police chases.

3 **SECTION 2.** A high speed chase will be defined as a police pursuit at a speed above 35
4 miles an hour and lasting for 3 or more minutes without a sign of stopping
5 or complying to officer demands.

6 **SECTION 3. A.** The law will be enforced by the state, and the pursuing officers

7 **B.** If the police officer fails to call off the chase or continues to pursue the
8 suspect at a high speed the officer faces suspension or termination of his
9 job. The officer can also be held partially accountable for any damages
10 due to the failure to end the high speed pursuit.

11 **SECTION 4.** This law will take effect immediately upon passage.

12 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Regulate Fair Competition in College Football

1 BE IT ENACTED BY STUDENT CONGRESS ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **Section I:** The current system of college football bowl games referred to as the
3 “Bowl Championship Series” (BCS) is hereby dissolved.

4 **Section II:** There is a limited group of public and private institutions controlling all
5 bowl revenue dispersement.

6 **Section III:** The existing college football bowl system is decided by computers,
7 coaches and media perception instead of actual on-field outcomes. The following
8 definitions will be used for the purposes of this law:

9 A. Existing college football bowl system shall mean the “Bowl
10 Championship Series” (BCS) including “The National Championship Game”

11 B. On-field outcomes shall mean the outcomes determined by head-to-head competition
12 between two opposing institutions.

13 **Section IV:** The provisions of this bill shall take effect for the 2012-13 football season
14 and continue indefinitely with a mandatory evaluation every four years to ensure fairness
15 and equity amongst all participating institutions.

16 **Section V:** The “Fair Trade Commission” (FTC) shall be responsible for enforcing
17 the provisions of this bill.

18 A. Enforcement – The “Fair Trade Commission” (FTC) will oversee institutional heads
19 to ensure compliance with fair competition practices.

20 B. Funding – No additional funding is foreseen in the implementation of this bill. If
21 unforeseen expenses arise it shall be funded from bowl game revenues.

22 C. Penalty – Violations result in offending institution being disqualified for government
23 funding in whole.

24 **Section VI:** All laws in conflict with the provisions of this bill shall be declared null
25 and void.

12 under will have to wait till they are 20.

A Resolution to Create A Military Moon Base

1 **WHEREAS**, The moon is the gateway to space; and

2 **WHEREAS**, A new committee established directly under the Department of Defense, to

20 must pass through the Visa station.

22 their families, along with a select group of volunteer pioneer citizens from
23 the United States, where United States legislation shall apply.

24 **E.** Fifthly a Foreign Affairs division prepared to receive parlay from
